



Worthy Brothers,

Can you feel it? Spring is in the air! The temperatures are going up and the days are getting longer. Can you feel it? The season of Lent is nearly over and Easter is on the horizon! Soon we will celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Can you feel it? The NC State Convention is just a month away and we are in the home stretch for this fraternal year. So many spiritual things and secular things happening at the same time. Almost like there is a divine plan out there being executed before our very eyes. We're nearing the end of another strong year for our Council. We've been involved in so many programs and done so much for so many in our parish, community and beyond. We have a lot to be proud of but, as I say virtually every month, there is still more to be done. Let's look at some recent accomplishments and then talk briefly about what is left.

We had our annual Fish Fry a few weeks back. We served nearly 400 meals and had an unbelievable turnout. Many thanks have already been sent out but are worth repeating here again. To the countless Knights who worked the event either cooking, serving, collecting money or helping to clean and run supplies around to everyone, to the gentlemen responsible for planning and purchasing all the supplies needed to put on this event and to the many others who couldn't work the event but showed out in support of it. My sincere thanks for a job well done. We've continued our work delivering food to Room At The Inn and Backpack Beginnings. We had a chance to hear from one of our recipients of our LAMB awards at our last Council meeting. We had a group of brothers attend an all-day Catholic Men's Conference in Charlotte. (a fantastic, inspiring and prayer filled day spent in brotherhood) and we managed to pick up a few new brothers in the process of all of our activities.

So, what do we have left? We've got a couple of very important Council meetings coming up. We have to nominate a new slate of Officers for the next fraternal year and subsequently read the list of names for the next couple of meetings before ultimately electing them to office in June. We are in the process of getting the remaining program reports (10784 forms) for our programs completed to finish filling out our SP7 form for STAR Council. We also have our State Convention taking place nearby in Winston Salem at the end of April. We still need to recruit a couple more new brothers to complete our membership portion for the year. In the midst of all this we have some additional LAMB activities being scheduled, several awards to give to some of our students at the school for Essay Contest and year end graduation. Our 4th degree brothers will be active in multiple activities during the Holy week and Easter Masses as well as Memorial Day weekend as part of our Honor Guard, we have rosaries to be distributed to all of our Confirmation and RCIA candidates and still have a couple of pancake breakfasts to conduct.

It never seems to end does it? I'm sure I've probably missed a couple of items that may be occurring in this list but you will see more communications about these in this newsletter and other emails. Such a busy time for us but I frankly wouldn't have it any other way. As we conduct all of this activity I remind everyone how all that we do is part of God's plan for us and we should look for ways constantly to let him in and deliver on this plan. RSVP - REFUND SUPPORT VOCATIONS PROGRAM (FEATURED)

Keep the faith alive by supporting our seminarians and postulants. As the strong right arm of the church, Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to our future priests and religious at all stages of their formation. As a featured program, RSVP counts for two credits toward the Columbian Award.

Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious. Through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians in their local area.

For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported.

Though financial support is vitally important, it is not the only aspect of the RSVP. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success.

Founded in 1882 byparish priest, Blessed Michael McGivney, the Knights of Columbus has always been a staunch defender of the priesthood and religious life.

As the strong right arm of the Church, Knights stand firm in their support of those in formation who will one day become the leaders of our faith.

After participating in RSVP, Knights of Columbus members and parishioners often reach new understandings in their own vocations as Catholic laity and people of faith. Together with their parishes, Knights and their families support the education and formation of priests and religious across the Order!

What are the RSVP funds used for?

RSVP is used by seminarians and those in religious formation to cover needs such as books, car insurance / maintenance, emergency expenditures and other livingexpenses.

What kind of moral support is given?

Knights of Columbus councils are called to aid their "adopted" seminarians and postulants with moral and emotional support as well as with prayers for their vocation and vocations throughout the church. This element is central to RSVP. Knights of Columbus councils provide support in a variety of ways including writing letters and birthday cards to their seminarian or religious postulant, sponsoring dinners to support them, and inviting them to fraternal events.

Persons eligible to receive RSVP funds include:

- Especially Seminarians from your local parish.
- Seminarians who have been accepted by a diocese and are currently in their "spirituality" year.
- Seminarians attending major seminaries in preparation for priestly ordination.
- Seminarians in their "pastoral" year.
- Seminarians attending minor seminaries.
- Seminarians who belong to a religious institute and are currently in formation for the priesthood.
- Men and women who are postulants or novices in religious orders or religious communities.

Persons NOT eligible for RSVP funds include:

- Priests or religious seeking assistance for continuing education.
- Religious brothers not studying for the priesthood.

• Candidates for the permanent diaconate.

Funds donated to each individual must be vocation-related and amount to at least \$500 per individual.

The funds must be given directly to an individual and NOT to an institution or fund.


The funds must be paid with a check[s] drawn on the council's account.


