That same weekend Bishop Martin announced St. Margaret Mary in Swannanoa, where both Monsignor Marcaccio and Father Cook formerly served as pastor, as our sister parish in western NC. Our council was in the fortunate position to be able to make a \$10,000 donation to kick start our parish's financial support of St. Margaret Mary. We also donated more than 400 new coats to those in need in western NC just in time for the cooler fall and winter seasons. We will continue to provide support as our brothers and sisters rebuild.

On November 3rd we lifted up the intentions of the parish during the monthly first Sunday Rosary. We brought together the parish in community for the monthly pancake breakfast on November 10th, and helped the Red Cross by sponsoring a Blood drive on November 20th. As we go through the Advent season it is a perfect time to join your fellow Brothers in prayer. Our last pancake breakfast for 2023 will be held on December 10th after the 9am Mass. We also continued to support Room at the Inn by delivering food donated by local grocery stores and restaurants, and to deliver lunches to several local elementary schools.

As we move to December we will continue with our many monthly activities. Please join us on December 3rd for the monthly Rosary and December 10th for our parish pancake breakfast.

We also will come together as a council for our annual Christmas party on Saturday, December 14th. I hope to see a great turnout as we celebrate the Season in brotherhood and friendship.

Help the Council support this fundraiser and have a chance to win a prize. Super Bowl LIX is February 9th, 2025.




