PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF**PICKUPANDROPOFF**

By the Grace of God and the well meaning actions of Catholic Action efforts of the *Knights Of Columbus* and the *Ancient Order of Hibernians*, we have had *PICKUPANDROPOFF* working here for the past year. It started last January when St. Pius X had a Right to Life meeting. I met Marianne Donadio, VP with *Room at the Inn*, Greensboro and asked her for a project that our two groups could get involved in on a very regular basis. She said her custodian, Jason, was spending too much time picking up food for the *Maternity Home* on Park Ave.

It started with me picking up a box donated by *Sheetz* on *Wendover* three times a week. It was wraps and things that were going out of date but still good. Soon the *Second Harvest Food Bank* added others to be picked up. We went to the Deli at *Harris Teeter* three times a week and *Chipotle* twice a week. The *Hibernians* gave us Mike Doyle to go to *Chipotle* and Mike Wachter for Wednesday at *Sheetz* and *Harris Teeter*, and Charlie Connolly for Friday at those two. We then added another *Sheetz* three times a week, and *St. Paul's Council*, Rick Anderson for the other *Chipotle* and a newly acquired *Papa John's Pizza*, who gave us between 5 and 12 large cooked, frozen pizzas on Thursdays. *Greensboro Day School* asked us to stop by on Fridays, and they have been most generous. My *St. Pius X K of C* Grandson, Bobby Lamothe took that on. *Kentucky Fried Chicken* added two locations seen each week by Mike Wachter and Ned Croghan.

This fall opened three major pickups and we got considerable help from *Council 11101*. *Food Lion* on *Meadowview* wanted us to stop by three times a week and go to three different departments there: Deli, Produce and Meat. The three to six large grocery carts full they gave us each time, had us bring on five more dedicated workers. Monday was Neil Rochette and Bryan Sutton. Wednesday was Steve Rockwood and Friday was Bryan Harvey and Walt Edwards.


PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF (con't)

The food all goes to a kitchen at the maternity home, an originally Diocesan sponsored home that houses 30 women a year, who are expecting or already had their babies. It is a true Right to Life activity because it provides a safe haven for women who have nowhere else to turn for help. They are helped medically and physically and spiritually with what they need to bring a child into this world. They are helped after birth with child-care, clothes, what they need to set up their new home, education and a job. That answers the question—after we talk and pray someone out of doing an abortion—what now?? Do we dump them and move on?

Thank you my brother Knights and Hibernians. For the ones participating, it seems like the kind of project we can sink our teeth into.

District Deputy Report

Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney

The Beatification of Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney took place in the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford, CT, on October 31st. Father McGivney is now one of only a handful of Americans, to be recognized as “Blessed”, and is now one step short of Saint-hood. This was the first Beatification of a Parish Priest held on U.S. soil.

This past May, he was approved for Beatification by Pope Francis, after the confirmation of a miracle McGivney performed five years ago.

The act designated as a miracle involved the healing of an unborn baby, who had been diagnosed with fetal hydrops. The baby was born healthy and named Michael in honor of McGivney.


The boy’s family attended the ceremony, which the child’s father, Daniel Schachle, called “absolutely surreal.”

“I thought about bringing a relic back to our house, but ever since Michael has been born we’ve felt like he was our own little relic,” Schachle said.

At the Beatification, Cardinal Joseph Tobin cited Father McGivney’s life as a son of immigrants, who “gave his life in pastoral service of those most recently arrived in this country” and “worked to keep families united in dignity and security. We are in the presence of an apostle who cared for victims of an epidemic before he himself would die of it” at the young age of 38.

Blessed Father Michael J McGivney pray for us and teach us to serve family unity everywhere.
