Dear Worthy Knights, here is an update of the LAMB program for your reference. The LAMB program has raised over \$4000 in 2022 to support those with intellectual disabilities. Our nomination committee is now working to determine the charities that we will support through a financial award.

The three charities being considered include:

1- Project SEARCH Spotlight:

Project SEARCH was first developed in 1996 at Cincinnati Children's Hospital and has grown to incorporate over 500 sites worldwide. When students in Guilford County complete the program, they work with either TEACCH or the Arc of Greensboro to secure integrated, competitively paid employment.

2- Peacehaven Farm:

Their mission is to connect people with intellectual and developmental disabilities to the larger community through shared living and the work of a sustainable farm.

3- A Small Miracle:

A Small Miracle, LLC, an Aymira Company, is a North Carolina Statewide agency that provides a comprehensive array of supports and services to children and adults of all ages, with all types of intellectual and developmental disabilities.

We will keep you posted on our final selections and distribution of the awards will happen in February.

Life Program

This is the monthly report of the Right to Life effort in 11101. There are two main things.

- 1. For the past two weekends we have seen Right to Life Marches in Raleigh, Charlotte, DC,, Los Angeles and San Francisco. It seems that we should be rightfully celebrating the end of Roe Vs. Wade after 49 years and the total end to abortions in 13 states since then. But it is not over yet in N.C. Please tell your congresswoman that she is voting against Human Life by taking the stand she does. And our state legislature could end the embarrassment of being the only full abortion state among our neighbors. One issue came up today at the San Francisco march was the pro abortion argument that we should ease up on rapists but give the death penalty to the results of their crime, the baby they have produced. It is time to stop feeling sorry for the rapist and concern ourselves for the baby. You have heard the argument. Please don't buy it.
- 2. The Walk for Life for our Pregnancy Center is set for April 29 at LaBauer Park, downtown Greensboro. Please put this event on your calendar and be there. This event is well supported by St. Paul's K of C and we should be there in force too. We gave serious money to them when we bought 2 Echo machines to show mothers what their baby is doing in utero. It costs \$200,000 to keep things going there and help these women who have made the right decision. More details next month.




