This prayer was written by Charles de Foucauld and it seems to fit the upcoming Lenten season. So often we are asked what are you giving

up for Lent? We respond sweets, beer, coffee, mid-day snacks and they all are acceptable and common goals for us to obtain during the 40 days of sacrifice. This year I would like to challenge you to be a better Catholic and better Knight. Instead of giving something up, let us commit ourselves to be mindful to say a daily prayer. Attend or say Rosary more often then you usually do. Commit to reading the daily scripture and take some time to reflect on its' meaning and how it we can incorporate that lesson to our daily lives.

Form #10784

Grand Knights, Program Directors and Program Chairmen are now required to fill out an after action report for each Program activity completed.

Form #10784 must be completed after all events. The form will be a good way for the council to remember what events took place, the number of knights who participated, the hours out into planning and the cost of each event. It will identify how well the program was advertised i.e. Church bulletin, Council newsletter or pulpit announcement.

It will ask if your council is in compliance with the Safe Environment Program.

It asks how successful the Program was.

It requires a description of the event and suggests any corrections for the next time.

Finally, it must be signed by the Grand Knight and Program Director.

Feb. 6th marked the 137th anniversary for our Order... The second month of the New Year calls for focus on recruiting...


If we are not recruiting and not focusing on young families, we are missing what Fr. McGivney put this in place for.
