Grand Knight's Message

Worthy Brothers,

We're through another month of our fraternal year and now headed into the Lenten season. Over the years many of us have looked at Lent as a time to give up things like sweets or alcohol or soda or whatever. It's kind of been an instant weight loss program for some. As was so eloquently put by our pastor last weekend during Mass, the season is not meant to be a built-in weight loss program.

We've been challenged to do three things during this period of time. Pray, fast and give alms. There are many ways we can do this just by getting involved in activities and events the Knights have scheduled.

- Prayer this is probably something most of us do on a daily basis. We're called upon to pray for many things and many people. How we do so differs for each. I'd like everyone to consider one way to do so by praying on the rosary that each of us as Knights has been given and encouraged to use often. I carry mine in my pocket and say a few prayers on it daily as I need to. I find it a comfort to do so especially during stressful situations. I would also challenge you to joins us for our 1st Sunday Rosary which will be March 3rd after the 9am Mass. You can join fellow Brothers in prayer during this time. At the bare minimum we should find a prayer we are comfortable with and use it as often as we can.
- Fasting usually people look at fasting as needing to stop eating something (like meat which we all do or the aforementioned sweets etc.) but fasting can also be defined as sacrificing something of yourself for the good of others. Consider volunteering some of your time for the pancake breakfast or our Fish Fry that is coming up. A few hours of your time helps out many others and also makes light work for everyone.
- **Alms** –instantly everyone sees this and thinks about having to give money. While there is certainly ample opportunities to give money to worthy causes, I also think of other things you can do. Donate food to the bins set up in the church for Urban Ministries. Give blood at the blood drives the Knights sponsor. Get involved in donating to our LAMB drives when we schedule them. It's not always about money. Some times the alms you can give are of your time which, if you are like me, is more valuable than money sometimes.

There are lots of opportunities for you to not only make the season of Lent meaningful but all throughout the year if you take the time to say "yes I can help with that" You'll most likely find that you are rewarded spiritually when you do.

I close this month's message with my continuing message about Membership. Remember we can "get busy living or get busy dying " We need Faithful Catholic men to join our Council to keep us vibrant and active. As always, please consider bringing someone you know into the Council.

District Deputy Report

1941-1950 WAR & PEACE

By the time of the Pearl Harbor attack and the United States entry into World War II in 1941, a KofC welfare program for servicemen had been well established by Canadian Knights, built and modeled on the Knights' World War I work at the Supreme Convention in 1944. The Order established a \$1million trust fund for the children of members who died or became disabled in World War II. Following the end of the war in 1945, the Order turned its attention to the growing threats of communism and fascism. To combat these dangers, the Knights launched in 1946 the Crusade for the Preservation and Promotion of American Ideals, which published books and pamphlets to educate the public on "the perils of communism".

Meanwhile, the postwar years saw a membership boom for the Order in the Philippines. Jesuit Father George J. Willmann envisioned the Knights as the premiere lay society in the Philippines and set about establishing councils and recruiting members. He appealed to the Supreme Council in 1947 for permission to establish three new councils in the Philippines and served as the country's first District Deputy. By the time Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart visited Manila in 1955, the Order had expanded to include 50 Filipino councils.

1941: When the U.S. enters World War II, the Order's outreach to soldiers is conducted via the National Catholic Community Service organization. The NCCS models many of its programs on the Order's successful WWI efforts.

1944: The Order creates a \$1million trust fund for the education of children of members who lost their lives in or as a result of World War II. This evolves into the current scholarship fund for use at Catholic colleges and universities in the US & Canada.

1945: John E. Swift is elected Supreme Knight. Among his first initiatives is to authorize funding for full-page advertisements in 12 major U.S. newspapers and five Canadian papers highlighting the dangers of communism. The ad offers a free copy of Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen's pamphlet, "Communism, the Opium of the People."

1946: The Order launches its Crusade for the Preservation and Promotion of American Ideals. Educational pamphlets on communism and the dangers of secularism are published and distributed. By August 1948, there are more than 1,300 K of C discussion groups.

1947: Several hundred radio stations broadcast K of C-sponsored programs with the titles "Safeguards of America" and "Foundations of Our American Ideals."

McGhmey, seletant pastor of St. Mary's Church in New Haven and some of his perishioners, the Connecticut state legislature on March 29, 1982, officially chartered the Grights of Columbus as a faternal benefit society. The Order is still true to its founding principles of charity, unity and fratemity.
