#### Fr. Michael J. McGivney Beautification

Fr. Michael McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, will be beatified during a special Mass Oct. 31 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford

On May 27, the Vatican announced that Pope Francis, who met with the board of directors of the Knights of Columbus in February, had signed the decree recognizing a miracle through the intercession of McGivney, clearing the way for his beatification. Once he is beatified, he will be given

the title "Blessed."

McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Today it is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization, with nearly two million members in more than a dozen countries.

Born in Waterbury, Connecticut, in 1852, McGivney played a critical role in the growth of the Church in the United States in the latter part of the 19th century. After his ordination in Baltimore in 1877, he

served a largely Irish-American and immigrant community in New Haven.

Amid an anti-Catholic climate, he established the Knights to provide spiritual aid to Catholic men and financial help for families that had lost their breadwinner.

#### **District Deputy Report**

**Building a Culture of Life** 

One of the most effective ways in which the Knights of Columbus has helped thousands of women save their children is through its Ultrasound Initiative.

Ultrasound exams, which are medically necessary throughout pregnancy for a variety of diagnostic reasons, use ultrasound waves to scan a woman's abdomen, creating a picture or "sonogram" of the baby. Without K of C support, most pregnancy care centers would be unable to purchase the ultrasound machines, each usually costing tens of thousands of dollars.

Providing ultrasound machines to pregnancy resource centers has enabled many thousands of pregnant women to see that their unborn child is a living human being. Ultrasound technology allows a mother to see her developing child and recognize the miracle of life within her. As a result, thousands of mothers have decided to have their babies.

In 2015 our Council, with the help of other regional Councils, purchased an ultrasound machine for the Greensboro Pregnancy Care Center. Recently, they changed their name to the Pregnancy Network, because they are expanding their area of service to include Forsyth County. In early 2021, they will launch a new Care Center where the need is greatest in Winston-Salem. They will need an ultrasound machine there as well. We will be asked to support the purchase of that machine. We hope you will be

generous, when that program begins.

FYI... the Supreme Council shares the cost of ultrasound machines with state and local councils, like ours. Since the Knights of Columbus Ultrasound Initiative launched January 2009 on the 36th anniversary of Roe v. Wade, the Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion in the United States, state and local councils have assisted qualified pregnancy centers by raising half the cost of ultrasound machines.

When a local council raises 50% of a machine's purchase price for a qualified care center, the Supreme Council matches the amount toward the purchase price of the machines, starting at about \$20,000. Supreme Contribu-

are drawn from the Knights of Columbus Culture of Life fund, which we donate to annually.

The Knights seek nothing less than the transformation of today's culture into a new Culture of Life. And the foundation of this effort must be the bedrock of the inviolable dignity of human life at every stage, and the realization that in the great family the Lord intends for his people, we are all our brother's keeper.

It is a little over a month until our national elections. One of the best ways to transform today's culture is by voting for Pro-Life political candidates. Make sure you all get out to vote and transform today's American culture into a new Culture of Life!
