This will be my 4th year participating in the 40 Days campaign, and even though it is not an official Knight's activity, there have been a number of our fellow brother Knights who have come down and prayed the Rosary and Divine Mercy chaplet in defense of the unborn and their mothers along with me. This is in no way a confrontational ministry, intending to harass or intimidate anyone, but rather is a quiet and yet very public way to respectfully implore Mary's help and God's mercy on all those who support and seek abortion as the solution to an unwanted pregnancy.

There is a mobile ultrasound unit on site every day that the facility is open, one from the Pregnancy Care Network, which was initially purchased by the Knights, and another that comes up from Thomasville several days per week. These offer expectant mothers who

come to the facility for an abortion something that the abortion facility will NOT do; the opportunity to actually see the baby that is growing inside their womb. In many cases, this is what changes the mother's mind about having the baby aborted.

If the holy Spirit so moves you, please come down to 2421 Randleman Road, Monday through Saturday for the next 40 days at 8 am, rain or shine, and join us in sending up a few prayers for these babies, their parents, and even for the misguided folks who are a part of the evil of the abortion industry in the world today. Trust me, God is listening.




**Society of St. Vincent DePaul is looking for Volunteers**
