# Grand Knight's Message

Worthy Brothers,

Well, here we find ourselves again, on the verge of more cancelled activities, mask mandates and potential shutdowns due to the coronavirus. As I write this letter, the status of our upcoming pancake breakfast is unsure, but I'm fairly confident that we will end up canceling it.

We do have, however, several opportunities coming up as we get closer to Christmas to be a help to those who need us, through the Coats for Kids and Box of Joy programs. Dan Allen and I will be taking the boxes of coats which were purchased earlier this year over to the new Backpack Beginnings facility next week, and we will begin our fundraising efforts soon to cover the expense.

I would like to see us unite as an organization this year to put together at least 50 boxes for the Box of Joy program. In 2020, Catholics united through the Box of Joy ministry to send Christmas gifts to over 61,422 children in developing countries. For many, a Box of Joy — filled with toys, clothing, school supplies, a rosary and the Story of Jesus — was the first Christmas gift they ever received. Project Leaders and their groups shop for children's gifts and pack the

Boxes of Joy. Each participant will receive a gift box and an envelope for their \$9 donation to cover the international delivery and help support Catholic missionaries in each child's community. We will then carry the boxes down to the collection

point at Belmont Abbey, which we could maybe even make a group trip.

Let's all keep our chins up and eyes open for opportunities to serve, in spite of whatever mandates and restrictions we may face in the coming months, and as always, pray for each other and our neighbors.

### Pancake Breakfast

It has been a long time since the last breakfast and if all goes well it will take place.

# Room At The Inn



# Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family? Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own? Maybe they did not know to whom to turn?

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's financial future; planning, life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs.
